The Pauline and Edna Hellstern Foundation Scholarship is granted to graduates of Pueblo high schools who will attend any college or university that grants four-year baccalaureate degrees. Several \$1,000.00 grants will be made to applicants who file a timely application and are selected by the Scholarship Committee.

Grants for a full school year will be divided into two portions, with the first half being paid to the school in September and the second half being paid to the school in January. In order for a student to receive the second half of the first year scholarship grant, the student must obtain a 2.5 GPA for the previous semester.

A student may apply for a grant in subsequent years, but must maintain at least a 3.0 cumulative GPA while in college. However, a student will not be preferred for subsequent grants over first-time applicants. In order to apply for subsequent grants, the student must complete a new application and submit it to the Scholarship Committee by the deadline for that new year's applications, and also, supply a transcript showing all of the student's grades through the end of the term prior to re-applying.

A first year applicant should submit a letter from a teacher or counselor indicating why the student is deserving of a scholarship. Such applicant should also supply whatever factual information is available concerning the student's academic achievements and school activities in order to support the student's scholarship application. Such applicant should submit a statement, not to exceed 200 words, on why a college education is important and how the student intends to use such education.

The Scholarship Committee will not consider an application from a high school student with less than a 3.2 GPA or less than a 22 ACT score.

The Scholarship Committee will consider an applicant's financial needs. A copy of the financial aid form used by the college of the student's choice should be completed and attached to this Scholarship Application form, along with copies of other material that the school requires in considering financial aid.

Successful scholarship recipients will be notified by letter and by announcement in *The Pueblo Chieftain*.

The application package should be mailed or delivered to the following office so that it is **received** by the following office no later than 5:00 o'clock p.m. on March 30, 2012.
